TRAINING MODULES

MODULE 1

Rational Prescribing in Emergencies and Crisis Settings

Addresses the clinical and ethical dimensions of prescribing medicines in resource-limited, high-pressure emergency environments.

Learning objectives

- Apply rational prescribing principles to emergency and displacement contexts
- Navigate essential medicines lists and WHO emergency health kit contents
- Manage common conditions with limited supplies: infections, trauma, chronic disease
- Recognise and avoid prescription errors and antimicrobial overuse in crises
- Apply triage logic to resource allocation and prescribing decisions

Target audience: Doctors, nurses, pharmacists, clinical health workers in crisis settings

Duration: 1 day **Format:** In-person / Blended

MODULE 2

Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) in Crisis Settings

Provides clinical and programmatic guidance on delivering the Minimum Initial Service Package (MISP) for SRH during humanitarian emergencies.

Learning objectives

- Understand the MISP for SRH and its implementation in acute emergencies
- Provide antenatal, postnatal, and safe delivery care in resource-constrained settings
- Deliver family planning and contraception services to displaced populations
- Respond to sexual violence with clinical care and referral pathways
- Address specific SRH needs of adolescent girls and women survivors of violence

Target audience: Doctors, nurses, midwives, reproductive health officers

Duration: 1–2 days **Format:** In-person / Blended

MODULE 3

Healthy Aging in Humanitarian Contexts

Addresses the specific health needs of older persons in displacement and crisis — a systematically overlooked group in humanitarian programming.

Learning objectives

- Identify the distinct health and protection vulnerabilities of older persons in humanitarian settings including GBV.
- Conduct age-sensitive needs assessments and functional assessments
- Manage non-communicable diseases (NCDs) in low-resource crisis environments
- Adapt community health and mobile service delivery models for older populations
- Integrate older person inclusion into broader programme design

Target audience: Health workers, programme managers, protection officers, social workers

Duration: 2 day **Format:** In-person / Online

MODULE 4

Addiction, Withdrawal and Coping in Emergencies and Crisis Contexts

Equips practitioners to identify, manage, and respond to substance use disorders and withdrawal in humanitarian and displacement settings.

Learning objectives

- Understand patterns of substance use and addiction among crisis-affected populations
- Identify clinical signs of intoxication and withdrawal across substance types
- Apply harm-reduction principles and first-line management approaches
- Navigate referral and treatment pathways in low-resource settings
- Design community-based awareness and early intervention activities

Target audience: Health workers, MHPSS practitioners, social workers, outreach teams

Duration: 1 day **Format:** In-person / Online

MODULE 5

Medical Waste Management and Environment-Friendly Healthcare

Provides practical guidance on safe medical waste handling, disposal, and environmental protection in healthcare settings operating during crises.

Learning objectives

- Classify medical waste types and understand associated health and environmental risks
- Apply WHO and national standards for safe waste segregation, storage, and disposal
- Manage sharps, pharmaceutical, pathological, and hazardous waste safely
- Design waste management systems for mobile clinics, field hospitals, and fixed facilities
- Integrate environmental sustainability practices into healthcare operations

Target audience: Healthcare facility staff, logistics officers, environmental health workers

Duration: Half day – 1 day **Format:** In-person
