TRAINING MODULES

MODULE 1

Protection Case Management in Humanitarian Contexts

A comprehensive introduction to protection case management principles and practice for humanitarian professionals working with displaced and at-risk populations.

Learning objectives

- Understand the principles and standards of humanitarian protection case management
- Apply case identification, assessment, planning, intervention, case follow-up, and closure processes
- Identify referral pathways and inter-agency coordination mechanisms
- Apply confidentiality, informed consent, and do-no-harm principles in practice
- Recognise and respond to protection risks among vulnerable population groups

Target audience: Protection officers, social workers, case managers, NGO and government field staff

Duration: 1 days **Format:** In-person / Blended

MODULE 2

Gender-Based Violence (GBV) in Humanitarian Contexts

Equips participants to prevent, identify, and respond to gender-based violence in emergency and displacement settings, with a focus on survivor-centred approaches.

Learning objectives

- Define gender, sex, and the cycle of violence and its forms in humanitarian settings
- Apply survivor-centred interview techniques and trust-building approaches
- Navigate legal rights and obligations related to GBV in the Turkish context
- Identify referral pathways and safe documentation practices
- Implement GBV protection and risk mitigation measures in field operations

Target audience: Protection officers, health workers, social workers, field coordinators

Duration: 1–2 days **Format:** In-person / Online

MODULE 3

Child Protection Principles

Introduces child protection frameworks, legal obligations, and identification/response mechanisms for practitioners working with children in humanitarian contexts.

Learning objectives

- Understand child protection principles, standards, and the Convention on the Rights of the Child
- Apply the legal framework for child protection in Türkiye
- Identify indicators of child abuse, neglect, exploitation, and trafficking
- Navigate reporting obligations and referral pathways
- Apply child-centred approaches in assessment and case management

Target audience: All humanitarian and social sector staff working with or near children

Duration: 1 day **Format:** In-person / Online / Blended

MODULE 4

Protection Against Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (PSEA)

Builds organisational and individual capacity to prevent sexual exploitation and abuse by aid workers, and to respond appropriately when concerns arise.

Learning objectives

- Define sexual exploitation and abuse and the humanitarian PSEA framework
- Understand organisational accountability and the six core principles
- Identify reporting mechanisms and obligations for PSEA incidents
- Guidance on how to conduct a PSEA investigation
- Apply safe and ethical complaint and feedback mechanisms
- Develop PSEA awareness and culture within organisations and field teams

Target audience: All humanitarian staff; required for organisational PSEA compliance

Duration: Half day – 1 day **Format:** In-person / Online

MODULE 5

Humanitarian Protection Mainstreaming

Enables organisations to integrate protection principles across all programme sectors — ensuring every humanitarian intervention avoids causing harm and actively promotes dignity.

Learning objectives

- Understand the four protection mainstreaming principles: prioritise safety, avoid discrimination, ensure access, support participation
- Conduct programme and organisational protection risk assessments
- Integrate protection analysis into project design, implementation, and monitoring
- Apply do-no-harm and conflict-sensitivity frameworks in diverse contexts
- Build internal systems and checklists for ongoing protection mainstreaming

Target audience: Programme managers, MEAL officers, sector coordinators, team leaders

Duration: 1 day **Format:** In-person / Blended
